

Bordeaux 2022 Vintage Report

A Bordeaux vintage as complicated as 2022 needs unravelling and our roles as wine merchants is to pick through the successes and challenges facing the Bordelais to provide a concise view on the vintage as a whole. As many UK merchants descended on Bordeaux during the formidable En Primeur week, our team charged up on coffee and managed to taste through over 300 barrel samples to bring you our own views on the 2022 vintage.

2022 has turned out some stunning examples of what Bordeaux can produce but before we delve into the specifics, we must discuss the growing season. 2022 was recorded as one of the hottest years in France and early on concern was spread across the faces of vignerons. Three heat waves peaking in mid-June, July and August touched 40°C putting vineyards under significant pressure and vignerons were facing one of the earliest harvests ever. Early conditions were similar to the troublesome 2003 though sufficient rainfall in the preceding winter and early spring crucially kept water reserves. Another factor was that overnight temperatures managed to plummet, locking in freshness and reducing the development of any baked, jammy characteristics. Neal Martin summed the growing season up perfectly saying it was *"a season of paradox and luminosity"*. Berries were smaller than in 2021, tightly packed with thick skins and those châteaux with water retaining clay and limestone soil performed particularly well. Vignerons were forced to bring harvest forward and it was long and slow with picking for the whites starting from the 2nd week of August and towards the end of August for the reds. Compared to the Bordeaux average yields were down despite being up on the 2021s. Fruit that made it through a rigorous selection process in both the vineyard and sorting tables turned out very good quality, so much so some châteaux didn't feel the need for a second wine as the majority of juice went into the Grand Vin. Where made, many second wines are worth seeking out.

So what of the wines? There are some astonishing reds wines this vintage and some that have missed the mark. It is not a vintage to buy blind and despite exceptions not a vintage to buy to drink young. The most patient of you will be rewarded greatly. The style is deep in colour with bold structures, robust tannins and plenty of phenolics across most regions. Merlot thrived in 2022 and Left Bank producers used higher proportions in their blends with increased use of Petit Verdot than in previous vintages. Naturally prices and volumes are a factor in determining how a vintage compares to its predecessors and with production volumes down in 2022, released quantities will be tighter and prices will show that. However, there are plenty of wines to pick out in the top appellations from both banks. I have dissected each appellation overleaf.

Saint Emilion & Pomerol

Saint-Emilion was firing on all cylinders in 2022 with **Cheval Blanc**, **Canon** and **Figeac** attracting the big scores, but there is plenty down the price scale to keep customers interested, the likes of **Troplong-Mondot**, **Beausejour** (**Duffau Lagarrosse**), **Pavie-Macquin**, **Larcis-Ducasse**, **Laroque & La Gaffelière** should be sought out. A notable mention goes to **Vieux Château Saint André**, the home of ex-Petrus winemaker Jean-Claude Berrouet. Next door in Pomerol, **La Conseillante** and **Vieux Chateau Certan** will attract the attention but don't overlook the likes of **Clos du Clocher** which is a new listing on our books.

Pessac-Léognan

The best of **Pessac-Léognan** showed what they are capable of with some contenders for wines of the vintage, **Les Carmes Haut Brion** showing once again how to produce a world class wine. On the other side of the appellation, the seriously impressive **Haut Bailly** are on the second vintage from their spectacular new winery and this is a wine worth seeking out. **Domaine de Chevalier** also produced a stunner in what was Olivier Bernard 40th vintage, commemorated with a special label.

<u>Margaux</u>

Up in Margaux, Château Palmer was stupendous and the 2022 is on par with Château Margaux amongst the critics. For value, Brane-Cantenac picked up the same 96-98 score as both Palmer and Margaux from Neal Martin and is a contender for value pick of the vintage. Rauzan-Ségla & Giscours are notable picks too.

Saint-Julien

Continuing up the coast, **Léoville Barton** has been described by William Kelley as one of the stars of the Médoc, and likened to two brilliant vintages – the 2019 and 2016. Sister estate **Langoa Barton** have produced a bargainous beauty. Second growth **Léoville-Las-Cases** picked up five potential 100 points though will be incredibly hard to get hold of, and **Talbot**, **Gloria** & **Branaire-Ducru** are easy picks for customers looking for great quality drinking Bordeaux.

<u>Pauillac</u>

First Growths, **Lafite** and **Mouton** in Pauillac have once again produced classically styled, mesmerising wines, though don't overlook **Pichon-Lalande** which picked up a potential 100 and three 99 points. **Pichon-Baron** is not far behind. **Pontet Canet** and **Lynch-Bages** gave the First Growths a run for their money with 99-100 and 98-99 points respectively from James Suck-ling. Both were brilliant. **Grand-Puy-Lacoste** was another absolute gem and the 2022 received one of its best ever scores from Neal Martin (96-98).

Saint-Estèphe

Château Montrose is the pick from Saint-Estèphe, outshining fellow Second Growth **Cos d'Estournel.** At the most northerly of all the Médoc Grand-Crus Classés, **Calon-Ségur** and stable mate **Capbern** produced deeply concentrated, structured wines despite hail decimating some vineyards at Calon resulting in volumes being reduced by 40%. A notable mention to **Château Phélan Ségur** which is punching so far above its weight whilst picking up a seriously impressive 95-97 points from Neal Martin.



Other Left & Right Bank

Château Marjosse is an easy pick for the deal hunters amongst us, plus is Lisa Perrotti-Browns 'Bargain of the Vintage'. She awarded this sub-£100 case an eye opening 93-95 points. **Marsau** was also an accomplished star and for £99 per 6 IB it is hard to find better value for your money.

Whites & Sauternes

2022 was a tough vintage for whites however there were some standouts. The heat and drought causing issues, though **Do**maine de Chevalier Blanc & Château Pape Clément Blanc from Pessac-Léognan defied the conditions and still managed to produce some class, Château Doisy Daëne from Barsac is the pick of the sweet wines.

"The 2022 Calon-Ségur is another superb wine from this historic Saint-Estèphe third growth that began a comprehensive renaissance the better part of a decade ago. Unwinding in the glass with aromas of cassis and blackberries mingled with hints of fresh mint, burning embers, licorice and violets, it's medium to full-bodied, layered and concentrated, with terrific depth at the core, supple tannins and a long, saline finish. The blend consists of 57% Cabernet Sauvignon, 34% Merlot, 7% Cabernet Franc and 2% Petit Verdot. Vincent Millet observed that "when you tasted the Merlot, you were under the impression that you were tasting Cabernet."

Its deep purple hue is followed by a heavenly bouquet of cassis, smoke tobacco, flowery incense, and toasted spices. 
